

**BLUE GRASS SPORTSMEN'S LEAGUE**  
**Handicap/Disability Unlicensed Vehicle Policy**  
**Adopted February 2, 2005**

The Board of Officers and Directors of the Blue Grass Sportsmen's League meeting in session on Feb. 1, 2005 does hereby adopt a Handicap/Disability Unlicensed Vehicle Policy.

Any Blue Grass Sportsmen's League member issued a Kentucky state handicap/disability permit or any member recognized by another qualifying state or federal agency as disabled (i.e. Federal Social Security Administration, State Worker's Comp Board, KY Teacher Retirement System, United States Railroad Retirement Board, Veteran's Administration, United States Office of Personnel Management) shall be eligible to receive BGS� Handicap/Disability permit to operate an unlicensed vehicle on League grounds.

The BGS� Handicap/Disability Permit allows the member to utilize alternative transportation options (i.e. ATV's, golf carts, and mechanized wheelchairs) while on Blue Grass Sportsmen's League property.

Members wishing to obtain a BGS� Handicap/Disability permit may obtain the necessary form from the Operations Manager at the club office. The member shall present proof of membership, current Kentucky handicap/disability permit or official "disability authorization card", and acceptable photo identification.

Permits will expire one year from the printed issue date.

BGS� handicap/disability permit holders may:

- A member may use alternate transportation options while traveling any maintained road on BGS� property.
- Members may only leave maintained roads to gain access while actively utilizing:
  - the lake
  - ranges
  - approved activities within the division boundaries (i.e. dog training, placing birds, )
  - legitimate hunting activities with prior notification/approval
  - other reasons as approved by the Operations Manager
- All road restrictions in place for vehicles are applicable to Permit holders.
- Permit holders must display the BGS� Handicap/Disability Permit on the rear view mirror of their car or truck when left unattended on the property.
- Permit holders must visibly display, on their person, the BGS� Handicap/Disability Permit in a location readily observable by operations and other members. (pinned to the outer garment, located on the upper back,)
- All alternative transportation options shall have lights permanently installed and operating during the hours of darkness.
- BGS� Handicap/Disability Permit holders are the only individuals allowed to use alternative transportation.

Actions that are not environmentally sensitive are not acceptable. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in the immediate suspension of the BGS� Handicap/Disability Permit by Operations Personnel. The member shall then be subject to a review hearing before the BGS� board before the permit is re-instated.
