Youth Division News

Also coming up this summer will be a Hunter Education class, fishing tournament, orienteering class, campout and anything else that we can come up with that sounds fun and educational. Come out and support the future of our league – your knowledge and involvement can only help perpetuate the ideals of our organization.



Trap Tips by Charlie



I was discussing with some of the long term trapshooting members about having a column “Introduction to Trapshooting” for members of BGSL, and they were in agreement that this would be a good idea. I will tell you that I am not an expert in target shooting but I am familiar with the fundamentals and rules of the game and hopefully some of my experience will be useful to you.

I would like to start with GUN SAFETY and RANGE SAFETY. Shotguns, when handled properly, are very safe. At the Trap Division you are not allowed to load your gun until you are on the firing line and have your weapon pointed down range (toward the trap house). When not on the firing line we require you keep OPEN and UNLOADED unless the gun is sitting in the gun rack. We have a great safety record and we want to keep it that way. This means when you are at the trap division you must keep “break open guns” broken (open) down when handling them and semi-automatics (and pumps) with the chamber open. You may not put more than one shell in the gun unless you are shooting doubles, then you are allowed two shells. We require that you pick up your hulls and would suggest that you have a hull bag (I hate to bend over to pick up hulls).

The next item of safety is PROTECTION of the shooter. On the trap range it is MANDATORY to wear eye and hearing protection. The small foam plugs work nicely. Personally, I wear plugs and hearing muffs. The good Lord only gave you two eyes and two ears, let’s protect them. WE also need for you to wear eye and ear protection when you are on the sidewalk behind the firing line. This is also required for spectators that are behind the shooting line.

Let’s get started with some basic instruction. . You need to know which is your ‘master or dominant eye”. When you mount your gun, if your dominant eye is not in line with the gun barrel, you may have to close one eye, or use tape (or a ‘dot’) to block the sight of the bead. Many women have cross dominance problems and may have to shoot with one eye closed. How do we use our eyes when shooting trap? Trapshooting is different than rifle or pistol. The beads on your gun are mainly to help you line up your gun and your focus should be BEYOND and ABOVE the trap house. If you are looking at your beads when you are shooting, you have the wrong technique. Your “eyes” need to be in “soft focus” above the trap house looking for the target. Your eyes need to be level. An old adage in trapshooting is to “bring the gun to your face (keep your head up and still when mounting the gun) and not your face to the gun” (i.e. putting the gun to your shoulder and lowering your face to the gun). Practice your gun mount in a mirror at home. Your head should be upright and your eyes almost perfectly level. One eyed shooters must use a lower hold point, (the gun is pointed initially at the trap house), so that you can see the target as soon as it emerges from the trap house. Two eyed shooters can hold either low as a one eyed shooter does, or a little above the house.

I will try to give some instruction, hopefully, every month. There are several trap members at the range that will be more than happy to answer your questions or clarify what I have put in this column. If you have specific questions, please email me. They may be the same question that your buddy has and will make a good subject for the next column.

Lead Reclamation: Bids have been taken for potential lead reclamation's and reviewed by the exe comm.; some dozer work has been done downrange of trap / skeet in preparation for the future lead mining.

Livestock: No cattle have been bought or sold

Fence: New field fence has been built along the road from the silo to barn # 5

Cost-Share: The application for additional cost share monies for invasive species removal is still being processed. NRCS tell me that I should have an answer (either approved or denied) by the end of April. The current request for removal of certain plant species encompasses about 50 acres.

Reminder about the spring turkey hunt: A note to buy your turkey lottery chances now before the general meeting next week – only \$10/ chance or \$40/5 chances! Five successfully drawn to hunt the spring season.

Field Burnings: Several fields have been burned since the last BOD meeting. Fields were primarily burned as management tool. (Advise of KDFWR).

Timber Harvest Updates: All tracts marked for harvest have been cut, skid roads / yards have been inspected by Div of Forestry personnel, and additional gravel spread to repair damages. Yes the Logging Company paid for the gravel.

Seedlings: BGSL will be planting a few tree seedlings in areas of the property. We'll look to set out maybe 400 – 500 seedlings this spring. Species will be redbud, flowering dogwood Plum, and black walnut. We will try to have a few leftover seedlings available for the membership next week.

Membership Committee:

We have run out of DVD's and need approval for the purchase of more.

Old Business:

Lead Reclamation: We have sent out for 3 bids have received 2 back. The recommendation from the Executive Committee is to use Gibson Rickets; the payout is 70/30 % split for the 1st 100 thousand pounds and a 60/40% split for everything over 100 thousand pounds. BGSL will receive 30% and 40% respectfully.

Rob Mulcahy presented the General Liability Insurance:

This is going to be an \$8000 savings to the club as well as increased coverage; they are more open for offsite events.

New Business:

Redoing lights in the Club house:

The cost to retro fit the 2X4 light fixtures is \$23.10 a fixture, there are 50 fixtures in the building. This will save 38 watts a fixture and bring the fixtures up to current lamp manufacturing. The lamps currently in the fixtures are set for manufacturing discontinuation sometime in 2011. This retrofit will cost about \$1155 to do the 50 fixtures.

Conservation Officer Foils Burglary Attempt

Nicholasville police and the Jessamine county sheriff are seeking a person who ran from a Jessamine County convenience store last Friday night when a conservation officer from the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources interrupted a burglary in progress.

The burglary suspect dropped a duffle bag filled with cigarettes, lottery tickets, and other items and bolted from the closed store as Jessamine county conservation officer Rufus Cravens Jr. pulled into the parking lot of the Pit Stop food mart on Richmond Avenue around 10:20 PM. Cravens was turning around while on his way to investigate reports of illegal hunting.

Cravens noticed broken glass on the ground and that the store's front door was broken out. He then saw someone inside the dark store run toward the front door from behind the counter. As Cravens exited his vehicle he yelled at the person to stop, but the suspect continued running around to the back of the store and into a tree line. Cravens gave a chase, but when the suspect disappeared into the dark of the tree line, he returned to his vehicle and immediately notified the Jessamine County police dispatch.

The Nicholasville Police Department is handling the investigation. The suspect is described as approximately 5-foot 9-inches tall and 160 pounds wearing baggie light-colored jeans, a dark shirt, dark shoes and a white coat with hood.

Current Legislature:

SB64 –

1. Asked for term limits for Department of Fish and Wildlife Commissioners,

LKS has asked for this since 2006.

2. This bill also requires a yearly audit.
3. Requires Senate confirmation on Commission Members.
4. Requires there be no net loss in public hunting land.

5. Allows for bow hunters to carry a firearm while bow hunting. This was part of HB 429 which is dead in committee.

Recruitment

Had at least one non-member to actively participate in one or more youth events during the year.

We had a lot of active youth during the year, however, two individuals stood out as our candidates for this award. When we sat down and reviewed the criteria for this award and how each of these individuals qualified, the Youth Division could not present this award to just one individual this year. These are two exemplary youths and we are proud to announce that we are giving this award to both this year.

Jessi Johnson

This young woman is a third generation member and has been a member for 15 years and active for the last four.
