

## Revised 300 Yard Rifle Range Policy

On Tuesday, November 30, the BGSL Board of Officers and Directors voted to adopt the **Revised 300 Yard Rifle Range Policy** appended below. Effective immediately, the Revised Policy is a modified version of the earlier <u>Temporary Range Use Policy</u> for the 300 Yard Rifle Range.

The revision is a withdrawal of the rimfire only condition for use of the range outside of sanctioned events. Qualified members may now shoot centerfire firearms on the 300 Yard Range when it is open and staffed. The status of the 300 Yard Rifle Range will continue to be updated regularly on the BGSL Website Calendar.

## Revised 300 Yard Rifle Range Policy

-

(Effective November 30, 2021)

- Shooting will only be permitted on the 300-yard rifle range under one (1) of the following two (2) conditions:
- o (i) at a BGSL sanctioned competition/event (ii) under the supervision of a qualified individual on site at the 300-yard rifle range (match director, NRA/USPSA/IDPA certified range officer);

OR

- o (i) during specified operational hours of the General Purpose (GP) Range (ii) under the supervision of a qualified individual on site at the 300-yard rifle range (match director, NRA/USPSA/IDPA certified range officer), and (iii) each shooter must possess a BGSL Advanced Rifle Certification.
- In either situation, the following shall also apply:
- Only firearms and ammunition that comply with BGSL's existing range use rules will be permitted (currently, single projectile guns only on this range; includes muzzleloaders, shotguns firing slugs, and scoped handguns designed for extended range shooting. Cartridges up to but not including .50 BMG are allowed);

## AND

o no rounds shall be chambered without having acquisition of the target through the sighting system of the firearm.
